Lots of big nights at Deco O'Mahony's gaffe after the championship would finish up - some doors and windows were repaired through the years.

Favourite teammate?

Plenty of top teammates. I lived with Deco O'Mahoney for a while in Dublin, playing with Darren Hayden and Roddy Caroll was unreal to see them compete, but I was groomsman at Ronan Hannaway's wedding last year and he was a serious full back too so he earns top spot.
